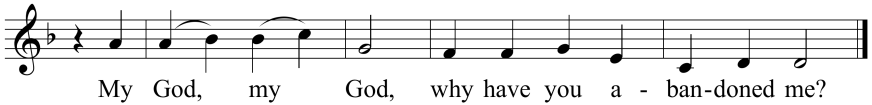

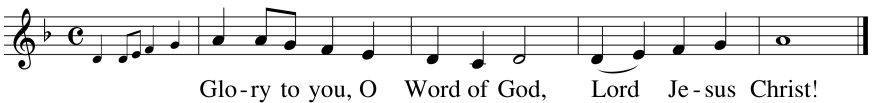

PROFESSION OF FAITH STAND
