



PROFESSION OF FAITH STAND


Ah, holy Jesus, how have you offended, that we to judge you, have in hate pretended? By foes derided, by your own rejected, O most afflicted.

Therefore God has highly exalted him, and bestowed on him the name which is above all names.




PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS STAND
